# The BEST Christmas Cookies

These delicious gingerbread cookies will really make you the talk of the day. The ingredients you will need are:

- 2 ¼ cups of all purpose flour
- ¾ cup of butter, soften
- 1 cup of white granulated sugar
- 1 egg
- 2 teaspoons of ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon of baking soda
- ½ teaspoon of ground clove
- 1/14 teaspoon of salt
- 1 tablespoon of water
- 3/4 teaspoon of ground cinnamon
- ¼ a cup of molasses

Start by preheating you oven to 350F. Then sift together your flour, ginger, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves, and salt in a medium sized mixing bowl. Set that aside. In a large mixing bowl, cream together your butter and sugar until it is light and fluffy. Beat in 1 egg and then stir in the water and molasses. Gradually stir in your dry ingredients into your wet ingredients.

Now roll dough onto walnut sized balls then roll them in sugar. Place cookies on a greased baking sheet and then flatten lightly. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes in the preheated oven. Allow cookies to cool on baking sheet for 5 minutes before removing to a wire rack to cool completely. Store in an air tight container.

And there you go! You have the perfect cookies to serve on Christmas Day!
